

Recycling Guide

Carefully pull out this helpful recycling guide and stick up in your home so everyone in your family will know what can be recycled.





- Be helpful at home and school by putting paper, plastic bottles, food tins and drinks cans in the clear recycling sack
- Rinse out any food and drink containers before you put them into the clear sack
- Put all food and garden waste in the green bin
- Put the yellow battery bag when full on top of your green bin
- Put all non-recyclable rubbish into black bin bags (not supplied by MK Council)
- Put rubbish and recycling on the boundary of your home by 7am on your collection day

Oon't mix your rubbish with your recycling. If you do everyone's recycling will be spoilt and may not be recycled

On't put out your recycling earlier than 5pm the day before your collection day

On't pile up your bags with the neighbours in your street

Important nappy information!

If you have a little brother or sister who wears disposable nappies please make sure your parents put all nappies in the black rubbish bag!


